Team Names Explained

Have you ever wondered the meaning behind some of the team names in our league? We asked the captains and got some great answers!

ATAlanta FC:

Atalanta was a mythological woman known for her prowess in the foot race, which seemed appropriate to Jean Carson and her teammates when forming their team name!

Five Seasons:

The team was formed back in 2003 and at that time, was initially sponsored by a brewpub called 5 Seasons that was in Atlanta. Even though the restaurant has since gone out of business, the team decided to keep their name.

Donas da Bola FC:

This team wanted to keep their essence and Brazilian culture while picking a team name. Donas da Bola means "Queens of the Ball" and is also a very famous Brazilian TV show!

Clash:

This team has been with GAWSA for over a decade, and it's thought by the current captains that the inspiration for their name was by the band, The Clash!

Fire Ants:

Team captain Joy describes the inspiration behind this name as being a "silent, sneaky sting" just like the bite from a fire ant.

United FC:

This team name actually pre-dates the foundation of Atlanta United, with team captain Michelle saying that it was voted upon by team members several years ago from a list of many other options!

Arse-n-All 988 FC:

This team name was created in honor of the team's dear friend and teammate Kimberly Rogers who was lost to suicide in June 2022. The number 988 is the Suicide Prevention Hotline, while the "Arse" part is all for Kim and her vibrant personality and love for funny T-shirts.
