On September 6th following a 2-1 victory over Nigeria, the USWNT held an official signing ceremony for the collective bargaining agreement signifying equal pay between the men's and women's national soccer teams. This allows for identical pay structures for appearances and tournament victories, revenue sharing, and equitable distribution of World Cup prize money.

While we will never know what was going on in her mind those last few hours, we choose to not dwell on those moments of shock and sadness, but in her fierce spirit that she showed on the field. Kimberly's vibrant

personality was a true force to be reckoned with and she was one of those genuine people who didn't shy away from telling you how she truly felt. She made us both laugh and cry with her honesty, sometimes at the same time, and we are forever better for knowing her.

She only played a few years with our team and in our league, but she was dedicated to the sport. Being on the field was her happy place, next to spending time with her family and grandson, Maddox. He knew her as Kiki, we

knew her as inappropriate! But that was a part of her we can always look back on with fondness and smile.

To honor her, we have changed our name to Arse-n-All 988 FC. If you were not aware, the Suicide Prevention Hotline recently changed it's number to one much easier to remember, 988. The "Arse" part is all for Kim! She loved funny T-shirts and I will wrap this up with the one that she wore most often: Long Story Short, I'm a Dope Chick.
